Catherine Warn Preovolos died peacefully at home on May 24, 2021.

Born in Vallejo to Floyd and Ursula (O'Hara) Warn in 1950, Cathy was proud of her roots in Solano County, which dated to Irish immigrants in the late 19th century.

Cathy devoted her life to her community, first as an elementary school teacher and long-serving school board member in Vallejo and later working in government affairs and volunteer services at Kaiser Permanente. In 2007, Cathy received the Athena woman of the year award from the Vallejo Chamber of Commerce.

She was active in local service clubs and served on several commissions and boards for the city of Vallejo. Cathy was proud of her membership in P.E.O. International, an organization devoted to funding college scholarships for women.

Seven years ago, Cathy was diagnosed with multiple myeloma and spent her remaining years steadfastly supporting her friends and family. Cathy touched

the lives of those around her in immeasurable ways and has left a legacy of love and perseverance.

Cathy is survived by Michael, her loving husband of 50 years; children Christopher (Megan), Elizabeth (Alirio) and Stephanie; grandchildren Magdalena, Cayetana and George; and siblings Sue and Jon. She was preceded in death by her parents and brother Peter.
