In the spirit and culture of his homeland, he founded the Vallejo Guam Social Club to connect with other area islanders and proudly entertained and hosted the first elected Governor of Guam, Carlos Camacho, on their first visit to Vallejo. Eagerly bringing his culture to Vallejo, he hosted many Little League & Babe Ruth Baseball teams from Guam, inspiring many with his hospitality and guidance. Enrique, the quintessential adventurer and family man, was constantly building a haven where family and friends could gather and enjoy many of the traditions he'd carried with him from Guam. Many great times were shared as he always welcomed family and friends to join them at their rustic cabin in Clearlake and eventually the Rojas Ranch in Winters, CA for a fiesta and pig roast. He spent his days enjoying the beautiful family he created, sharing the wisdom & traditions of his island culture as well as his experiences here in the States

with his grandchildren and great grandchildren. Enrique was a natural born leader who lead his family with God & love through the adventure of life.
