He was a Veteran, FTG2 (Fire Control Technician, Second Class) E-5 Petty Officer Second Class who served in the U.S. Navy on the Aircraft Carrier USS Ranger (CVA-61).

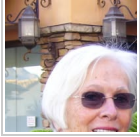

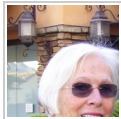
