As a teen/growing teen - I remember that every time I went to visit my auntie and uncle, they were always together. They were always very welcoming and my uncle always jovial; a happy person and just someone you'd want to talk to and listen to. He had a keen eye about growing teenagers (as he had some, right!?) and would often give me advice. Now, as an adult - life hit hard times with my mother passing away and my father passing away, but he always had a cool and calm demeanor that helped ease the pain. My uncle was someone that made me feel comfortable as I faced tough times with how I saw life and brought peace in my life with his contributions and advice. I'm sure that all that have engaged with him can feel what I'm stating. He's definitely made an impact on my life and my way of being in one sense or another. That my friends and family is important because it is what you make of that impact that will reflect on what he's conveyed to you. He is and will be missed dearly and although distance kept that continuous communication going, at the right moments and right times, the right things were said and acknowledged - often ending with a sincere thank you and a hug.
