He looked forward to his visits from his granddaughter, Amber and her children in the summer.

He never complained, was always accepting and not judging. We would ask Daddy are you doing OK and he would answer Oh yeah...oh yeah...We will miss you Daddy and will always remember your smile.

Lee was preceded in death by his wife Ruth; daughter, Judy; and three very loved and spoiled weenie dogs, Precious, Tiffy and Pebbles.
