



Lina Ledda Ninobla

July 6, 1940 - December 2, 2022

Born in Balaoan, La Union, Philippines, Lina Ledda Ninobla lived most of her life in Vallejo, California, and passed away after a year-long battle with cancer on December 2nd, 2022. Passing in her Vallejo home, lovingly surrounded by her husband and children.

Lina was born on July 6, 1940, to her parents Ruperto Zambrano Ledda and Basilisa Olivar Ostrea. In Manila, Lina spent four years studying medicine at the University of Santo Tomas (UST). But in 1959, she decided to transfer to Far Eastern University (FEU) to proudly graduate with a bachelor of science in nursing 1963. That same year, Lina stayed in Manila and started her nursing career at San Lazaro Hospital (est. 1577). This is where she met her first roommate and future sister-in-law, Concordia Ninobla (Moreno). In 1965, Lina took the giant leap to immigrate to the United States where she would start her first nurse position at the Hospital of Jefferson Medical College (now Thomas Jefferson University Hospital), and she would reunite with her roommate Concordia (“Connie”) where she would first meet her U.S. Navy boyfriend & future husband, Guillermo “Gil” Ninobla.

In 1966, both Lina & Connie had plans to transfer their nursing careers to Chicago, Illinois, but their navy boyfriends convinced them to stay on the east coast where they would instead transfer to Presbyterian Hospital in Newark, New Jersey. November 4, 1967, Lina would marry her navy boyfriend Gil at

St. John the Evangelist Church back in Philadelphia and would settle in their first home as newlyweds in Fall River, Massachusetts. She would work at Union Hospital for over a year before she would follow her military husband to his new assignment in Charleston, South Carolina. And in 1970, Lina was blessed with the birth of her first son Joseph. Finding the right hospital to work at while being a new mother was a challenge, but an opportunity arose again with Lina, Gil & baby making the move to the west coast.

1972 was the year when Lina's family arrived in Alameda, California where her first job was at Alta Bates Hospital. Her husband would later change his status to a U.S. Navy reservist and the family would finally buy their first and only home in Vallejo, California in 1973. Lina would find her next career at Kaiser Hospital Vallejo as a hospital floor nurse (floating but mostly in pediatrics), and later working in the nurse's clinic. Lina's family also grew with the birth of her second son William in 1976 and the birth of her daughter Gemmalyn in 1978. But after 33 years at Kaiser, Lina finally retires in 2006 where she spend time with her hobbies like bowling, growing orchids, and traveling which included many visits to many religious sites around the world. However, she decided to come out of retirement one last time to work a few years as a home health nurse to assist in the opening of Mare Island Home Health in Vallejo. In the last years of her career, she had the opportunity to work alongside her son Joseph who remains working there today.

Lina was also passionate about her Catholic faith. In the 1980s, Lina & Gil devoted over 10 years to a crusading group that prayed the rosary daily at invited homes all around Vallejo. In the 1990s and onward, Lina & Gil were involved in the mission to build the 10 Commandment Tablets for catholic churches all over the country starting at St. Augustine Church, Daly City to Our Lady of Peace Church, Santa Clara, and eventually, her parish home, St. Basil's Church.

She was a loyal member of the St. Basil the Great Church in Vallejo where she was blessed with her children receiving their sacraments while also being active in the youth choir and youth group ministry. Lina was often seen attending Sunday Mass as well as Weekday Morning Mass in her later years. Years later, she accepted the privilege of being a Eucharistic Minister. She helped take lead in raising funds to send her children along with the youth ministry to Denver, Colorado to attend World Youth Day 1993 with Pope John Paul II. Lina was involved in the committee to bring the Sinbang Gabi masses to St. Basil's regularly each Christmas season. Since she was young, Lina's devotion to Our Blessed Mother was reflected by her support of the daily rosary of Fatima as well as starting the Prayer of the Seven Sorrows of Mary at the church. She was instrumental in bringing the statue of Our Blessed Mother from Portugal to be placed in front of Mary's Chapel. Lastly, St. Basil's blessed Lina & Gil by commissioning them to lead the newly formed Rosary-Making Committee. Thousands of handmade rosaries were made by their group and they continue to donate to people and causes around the world. Her faith shined through her actions in her life as well as her love for her family and friends.

Lina unconditionally & unselfishly loved her children and supported them all her life through the many highs and difficulties of their lives. She was blessed in return with her only son-in-law Anthony 2005, the return home of her eldest son in 2008 to support her & husband in their retirement years, and the final special blessing of the birth of her only grandchild Temple in 2018. She also made it her mission to continually help all of her & husband's relatives as many were slowly immigrating from the Philippines.

To say that her family and friends will miss her greatly is an understatement. Her laughter and smile brought joy at any gathering, and she would be the first to get everyone involved once the line-dance music started playing.

Between the many patients she cared for, fellow nurses and doctors she worked with, and the many friends & relatives she kept contact with all over the world, Lina was a well-respected and cherished colleague as well as a loyal friend & family member to many. In short, she was loved by all. It was said Lina was unselfish & kind to a fault. Often neglecting the needs of herself for the needs and well-being of her many friends and family. She will not be forgotten.

She is survived by her husband Guillermo, sons Joseph & William, daughter Gemmalyn Robles, son-in-law Anthony Robles, and grandson Temple. Survived by her Ostrea Ledda family of sisters Elsie Lucena & Judy Octaviano, brothers Junior, Nonong & Litong, remembering her passed sister Betty Abad, and all their families. Survived by her Pimentel Ninobla family of sister-in-laws Connie Moreno & Lucy Czejdo, brother-in-laws Manuel & Pol, remembering her passed brother-in-laws Lodring & Dr. Junior, and all their families.
