Victor Nevarez Sr. passed away on September 23 at his home and surrounded by his family. He had been a Vallejo resident since 1960.

Victor retired from his position as Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds at Kaiser Permanente in Richmond, CA in 1993 after 20 years. He was a founding member of El Club Alegre de Vallejo in the early 1970s. He served in the U.S. Navy in the 1940s. When he wasn't traveling with his wife, he was playing golf, working on landscaping projects, watching his favorite Westerns, and spending time with family.
