“ I am part of a family who were neighbors to the Jurasins when they lived on the corner of Alhambra Avenue and Beverly Drive in Vallejo. My brother and I were both paper boys there in the early to mid 1960's.

I remember that the Jurasins had some of the most elaborate Christmas decorations ever to grace a house in that area. They had a moving Santa Claus and reindeer, candy canes, multi-colored lights and all sorts of holiday music playing. Occasionally Mr. Jurasin would dress up as Santa and Mrs. Jurasin would be Mrs. Claus. They would hand out candy canes to those who passed by to admire their lights. It was a very special time.

The Jurasins also had one of the first color televisions in our neighborhood and I remember being invited to watch "Bonanza" one night with my family. What a treat for a young boy to see it all in "living color!"

I remember Mrs. Jurasin as a kind person who never had a cross word for those who behaved themselves. She and her husband gave my brother and me great tips for delivering their newspaper to their back porch door.

Mrs. Jurasin was always a good friend to my parents, Emil and Naomi Zumstein, and visited with them even after she had sold the property on Alhambra Avenue and moved across town.

She, along with her husband, were members of the Beverly Hills Improvement Association, which was instrumental in getting stop lights put in at various traffic intersections in the neighborhood.
